




FROM THE FOUNDER





2025 marks a major milestone in Baton Rouge. It's the 40th celebration of the Irish on the streets of the Garden District and Southdowns.

Noreen Coffey joins a short list of grand marshals that have traveled from across the pond to join Baton Rouge on the third Saturday in March for the largest statewide celebration of the Irish and the connections to South Louisiana. "To me, this is special," Pat Shingleton explained. "Forty years ago, I never could have imagined what this event would turn into and to have our dear friend Noreen lead the parade... we couldn't ask for much more."

Noreen has lived in Killarney, Ireland most of her life. She's now retired but was a teacher for more than 30 years. She spent two years teaching at St. Killian's mission in Zimbabwe



in the mountains near the border with Mozambique.

"I thoroughly enjoyed my time there," Noreen said. "Once I got over the initial shock of it."

The mission was about 50 miles away from the nearest town. Imagine having to collect firewood in order to heat water to take a hot shower!

"I remember driving home one night. The petrol gauge didn't work, so it was a guessing game... The headlights were a bit dodgy as well, and we were on a dirt road," Noreen explained. "It was the only time I was thankful for a thunderstorm because the lightning lit up the sky so I could see where I was driving."

Like most teachers, the reward for Noreen was learning of the success of her students years later.

"It was extremely gratifying to see so many of my past pupils in the teaching profession and telling me I had inspired them when choosing their career path."

These days, Noreen volunteers her time in several facets of Ireland. She was part of the Adult Literacy Scheme when it launched years ago. Noreen also volunteers with Killarney Tidy Towns. Killarney was named overall Tidiest Town in Ireland a few years ago.

Noreen spends a lot of time on the golf course, and she's quite good.

Noreen has been named Golfer of the Year twice at Dooks Golf Club in Glenbeigh, Ireland where she also won the Captain's Prize in 2014. Noreen and her sister. Mary also won the Club Championship Foursomes in 1996.

She was named Lady Captain of Killarney Golf and Fishing Club in 1994. Noreen was part of the organizing committee for the Curtis Cup in 1996 – a tournament between amateur ladies from the USA and the UK/Ireland.







The Killarney Golf and Fishing Club hosted the Irish Open in 1991, 1992, 2010, and 2011. Noreen's brother Denis was the tournament director and "volunteered" her services as the leader of the team recording the scores of the players.

Denis visited Baton Rouge for the first time in 2002 when longtime friend of the Coffey family – Ivar Quigley – led the parade. Denis would return two years later, this time as Grand Marshal.

Denis had a way of capturing the attention of the room," Pat said.
"We thoroughly enjoyed all of the years Denis came in for the parade because of the camaraderie, the stories, and the songs."

Denis died in 2011, but his impact on the Shingletons and the Wearin' of the Green Parade was palpable. Five others made the trek from Killarney in the subsequent years.

You might not have noticed, and that's always the goal of parade organizers, but rain was a major concern 24-hours before the start of the 39th Wearin' of the Green St. Patrick's Day Parade.

So many businesses in the Perkins Road corridor rely on the parade to make or break their years, and that's always contingent on big crowds which are usually influenced by the weather.

Cloud cover blanketed Baton Rouge in the early morning hours of March 16, 2024. South Louisiana was just hours removed from a deluge of rain throughout the day on Friday and much more rain expected Saturday and especially Sunday.

But as the sun came up, the clouds broke and made way for partial sunshine and 65 degrees for the 6th Shamrock Run. We certainly threaded the needle of rain coverage!

By 9:30 a.m., the celebration started for the Grand Marshal, Seimone Augustus.

It's difficult to come up with the appropriate title for Seimone after all she has accomplished in her basketball career, her business career and now her coaching career. But the title of Grand Marshal: that was a first.

"This is quite the accomplishment," Seimone told the crowd during the opening ceremony. "I've been many places, but it always feels good to come back home and celebrate amongst my community and my people."



By 10 a.m., they were off! Seimone's float featured an elaborate design by local artist Mark Fresh. Seimone and her family were armed with dozens of boxes of greenthemed beads, throws and thousands of mini-basketballs (hopefully you caught one).

About 90 other krewes and a dozen high school marching bands followed, showering tens of thousands of people with throws, good music, and a great time.

Many people look forward to traditional crowd favorites like the Ancient Athletes and their basketball goal mounted to a trailer. Kids and even some adults take turns taking a shot as the float rolls down the road. (The parade route is only two miles, but The Athletes burn off far more calories while dodging flying basketballs, grabbing rebounds and passing basketballs off to the next kid.)

Some relative newcomers to the parade are also gaining attention. Maybe you've seen the trolley float, the train float, the Raising Cane's float featuring "Cane," the jazz float and more.

We have some big plans to celebrate the parade in 2025. The celebration continues for the 40th Wearin' of the Green St. Patrick's Day Parade. More to come.

THE STORY OF THE STICK

A well-known Irish tool is the shillelagh which we call a walking stick. These sticks are designed to be lightweight for walking, but sturdy enough to withstand a duel. Shillelaghs are created from one solid piece of wood. Years ago, shillelaghs were used in the ancient dueling Irish martial art called Bataireacht.

We were very fortunate to have a sculptor by the name of Jim Eaves with Trinity Tree Consultants create the first walking stick for 2020-2022 Grand Marshal Todd Graves before the parade.

Jim carved another for Grand Marshal Tim Mockler in 2023. Tim's stick was created from a live oak that was removed after being severely damaged after a storm. This stick was the first for lim to incorporate a hand carved spiral feature as well as a painted feature. A shamrock and date were hand painted by his nephew Seth Langley, a local tattoo artist.

The shillelagh made for 2024 Grand Marshal Seimone Augustus is one of the most remarkable. This beautiful LSU themed walking stick was made from a cedar tree on the campus in 2024. The tree was growing alongside the LSU lakes and was removed due to the dredging project. Her stick has a three stranded triple pass Turks head to symbolize her #33, as well as a triple spiral hand carved below the pommel, the spirals represent: college, Olympic and professional aspects of her career. The eye on the pommel was hand painted by Seth Langley as a homage to Seimone's play at LSU.

SHAMROCK RUN MORNING

On March 16, 2024, there were 513 runners who crossed the finish line for the fifth Shamrock Run. A vibrant 5K that's captured the attention of the running community whether it's their first time, or fifth time participating.



While runners lined up that morning, wearing their best green attire, there was a lot going on behind the scenes. At the start and finish line is Moreau Physical Therapy. What started out as a boutique clinic has turned into a booming business with 23 locations in Louisiana and Texas. Al Moreau is the President of MPT and grew up in the world of physical therapy started by his father in 1977.



Early in the morning on race day, Moreau can be found directing runners, helping event organizers and other participants get to the start line. He says there's something about that Saturday morning that sticks out to people.

"I see some of the same faces every year, so we know that there are people participating every year that enjoy it that much, but beyond that I see new faces every year," said Moreau.



The physical therapy clinic moved into the Perkins Road location after a sandwich shop closed its doors. Moreau says they had their eye on the space because of the people primarily runners - in the area. Down the street is Varsity Sports, where athletes not only shop for shoes and apparel, but have made lasting friendships through the running community.

'We've been able - at that location in particular - to grow a very loyal following that has kind of transitioned to our other locations as well," said Moreau.





While the visibility of the Perkins Road location has been fantastic for MPT. Moreau savs it's located in an area of the city where people are physically fit, care about their health, and their wellbeing. Mark Fay has been with Moreau Physical Therapy

since 2015 and he's the Clinical Director at the Perkins Road location. Fay says that's one of the reasons why he came to the area, to get involved with the running community.

"It certainly brings out a different population on St. Patrick's Day with all the runners," said Fay. "It lets everyone know who doesn't know we're here that we are here. This has been a really good, positive vibe for us."

March 2025 will be the Shamrock Run's sixth event, but starting a run takes a village. The logistics came together with the help of MPT and Varsity Sports.

Jenni Peters at Varsity Sports had a vision long before it became reality. When The Wearin' of the Green Parade Group reached out for her help to get a 5K started, she already had a route in mind. The only problem was the **location - Varsity Sports** wouldn't be able to



handle the volume of people. Enter Moreau Physical Therapy.

"It was a little overwhelming that first year, making sure everything was correct, right, prepared," said Fay.

During the morning of the run team members from both businesses were helping keep things organized and on track. Fay says the best part of the day is watching the looks on people's faces as they cross the finish line.

"Whether it's people who have run a million times or whether this is their first 5K, it's such a good day in Baton Rouge," he said.

Along the route, runners are cheered on by people lining up for the parade. Runners bring their family and friends to the event, who all stick around after the race to enjoy cold drinks, food, and the morning leading up to the Wearin' of the Green Parade.

"I think the only thing that is stopping this from getting bigger is the route. People really like it. There are a lot of people I know that this is one of their favorite runs of the year," said Moreau. "It's just a fun, great event."

The clinic and the sports shop are a part of the fabric of St. Patrick's Day in Baton Rouge.











LOUSIANA IRELAND TRADE COMMISSION



Since the inception of The Wearin' of the Green St. Patrick's Day Parade in 1986, its message has reached far and wide. The launch of the St. Patrick's Day Parade originated at Zee-Zee Gardens. This pub gained success due to the creative direction of The Mabyn Kean Agency's marketing efforts and the Zee-Zee Gardens Gazette newsletter by attracting new patrons. Within the confines of the pub. The Baton Rouge Irish Club was re-established. When Pat Quigley opened Ivar's next door, another connection to Ireland was born. When our children, Mike Shingleton and Katie Maxcy, selected Noreen Coffey as the 2025 Grand Marshal, a mere phone call would have sufficed. Instead, Mabyn and I planned to travel to Killarney, a town in southwestern Ireland, to extend the invitation in person.

Several weeks before we left, Louisiana Senator Beth Mizell (R-Bogalusa) filed a bill to establish the Louisiana Ireland Trade Commission. 





WHAT SHOULD WE WEAR?

WEAR GREEN! Dress comfortably by checking the weather forecast the night before. Louisiana weather can be unpredictable, and we roll rain or shine!

WHAT MAKES THE ST. PAT'S PARADE IN BATON ROUGE DIFFERENT THAN OTHER PARADES?

It is organized by a family for families and friends. Southern crowds love to be loved by the Krewes and the way this is done is by tossing trinkets like cups and beads from the floats to the parade watchers.

HOW LONG DO YOU EXPECT THE PARADE TO LAST?

You can expect 2-3 hours from the start of wherever you are standing to watch it. So, if you start seeing it at 11, expect it to be finished by 2. The pace of the parade changes every year due to weather and humans.



IS PARKING AVAILABLE?

Parking is a rarity in the area.
Do not park on private or
commercial property unless you
have written permission. Road
closures will be posted on our
website days before the parade.

IS THERE RESTROOM ACCESS AVAILABLE?

WE ARE HAVING A HOUSE PARTY. WILL MY FRIENDS BE ABLE TO GET TO MY HOUSE?

Yes, but they will need to get there early. The Shamrock Run takes place on Perkins Road which closes around 7:30 a.m. There will be a small window of time after the runners leave the route. Police ask that residents create an invitation with their name and address on it so it can be shown to officers in case the streets are closed off.

HOW CAN I IDENTIFY A FLOAT?

Each float will have a float number posted on each side of the float. Use that number if you want to compliment a float or make a report. If you report them, please use their name and send a photo.






there was a larger breakdown. Wallace diagnosed the symptoms and coined the classic expression, "It threw a rod." He and I grew-up with the manual transmissions and the "H" with "four-on-the-floor," or "three-on-the stick." These gear boxes offered a gear selection of first, second, third, fourth and reverse, activated by the clutch. Once learned, it was "Happy Motoring*." I taught everything I know to my children while owning a manual transmission BMW 537-I.

Wallace, Katie Maxcy, Mike Shingleton, Mabyn Shingleton, and Bruce Kelfstrom all outvoted me and, in everyones best interest, it was decided that a new powertrain** was needed for the '47 Mack. Wallace suggested a few local shops but it was not in their wheelhouse to complete a repair.

Then, Wallace suggested Pellegrini Performance Group. They were referred to him by a friend in Madisonville. Owner Jay Pellegrini looked over the '47 Mack in Baton Rouge with his team, including Kyle Costanza and Nick Prevost. Wallace and Bruce, who also tinkers with the truck, were there too. They determined the engine-well size and

needed spacing for a new automatic engine with the traditional prindle***, motor mounts, gauges, wiring, and transmission.

On June 11, 2024, Rusty Gerace with No-Limit Towing transported the '47 Mack to Pelligrini for repairs. On two occasions we visited for updates. Jason Holden and the team continued the detailing progress.



A Chevy 5.3Is engine will be installed with an automatic 4l60 transmission, GM bell housing, automatic valve body and standard shift pattern. Powell could have provided a temporary repair for the truck but it would have only done further damage. It was the first year since 1990 the firetruck didn't roll.

The '47 Mack is a great parade tradition, which provides enjoyment for all. Look for it near the end of the 2025 parade.












PARADE MAP
